The Indy 500 is a television event that is not on TV in Central Indiana. The audience is massive. <u>WIBC</u> first broadcasted the race in 1946 & is now simulcast on <u>93.5/107.5/1070 The Fan</u>.

The Indianapolis 500 radio broadcast is a major undertaking! Every year on the last Sunday in May there are announcers perched high in each turn, pit reporters and an anchor in the tower. Across 200 laps, it's a marvel of seamless rhythm between announcers' high-energy descriptions at a pace to keep up with the cars traveling over 200 miles per hour.

The famous phrase "now stay tuned for the greatest spectacle in racing" was coined by legendary voice of the 500 Sid Collins. Today, the Chief Announcer is Mark Jaynes with his analysts and turn reporters being Davey Hamilton, Nick Yeoman, Michael Young, Dave Furst, Rob Howden, Ryan Myrehn, Chris Denari, and Rob Blackman.
